Can you believe we are already talking about the 3rd Annual Winter Sportsman's Raffle? The event will be held on Saturday, February 4th at the Suburban Collection Showplace from 11:00 until 5:00. How time flies! It seems like we just finished our first Winter Raffle and here we are on our third...

We will again occupy the same space as last year, the 140,000 sq. ft. on the East end of the hall. The look will be the same fir the most part. We will be adding a few more vendors, and some additional bleacher seating to help with the anticipated crowd. In 2015 we had 3,700, in 2016 we had 6,000 so, I'm going to anticipate a modest increase hoping for 7,500 people in attendance.

With the success of past events and a slightly larger crowd anticipated, I see a need for additional volunteer help at the event. Last year's 50/50 paid out \$20,536 to the winner and I expect that to grow this year. We gave away over 225 firearms all day and had 2 dozen side raffles that also did well. The more people that attend, the better off the Units and Clubs also do.

We are marketing the usual way and the Suburban Collection Showplace is helping big time. SCS has us on their internal webpage that is emailed to their entire customer base, our posters are displayed in 20 glass cases in lobbies, bathrooms, etc. across the complex. We have a 30' banner on the building that can be seen from I-96 and we are displayed on the electronic billboards that can be seen on I-96 and Grand River. SCS also shares our event on their Facebook page and postcard mailing to all their contact lists. Whew, I'm tired just trying to list all they do for us!

So, let's all give a final push this month to fill the room and show that the Shriners know how to throw a party. Anyone over the age of 16 can enter and volunteer. SHRINERS HOSPITALS FOR CHILDREN – ERIE By Bob Lee, 2011 Potentate, Moslem Shriners and 2015 & 16 Chairman of the Board of Governors

I want to thank the 4 Divans that recommended me to the Shriners Hospitals for Children-Erie Board of Governors and the Nobility of Moslem Shriners who supported me for serving as their Hospital Representative. I will cherish this experience as the best privilege, honor and responsibility of my Shrine career! It is hard to believe I have been on the SHC-Erie Board of Governors for more than nine years! Having followed Jim Panzenhagen, Emeritus Board member and past Chairman of the Board of Governors, beginning July of 2007, and holding several leadership positions on the Board, including the 2015 & 2016 Chairmanship, I have to say my Shrine goals in both the Fraternal and Philanthropic components of Shriners International have been achieved.

I anticipate a grateful and proud experience when I get my Emeritus Plaque at the January 11, 2017 Board of Governors meeting. I am also confident my replacement as Moslem's SHC-Erie Representative, Jack Horner, and my successor as Chairman of the Board of Governors, Jim McKinney, PP of Rameses Shriners will do their best to assure the Shrine input for maintaining our Hospital Mission at SHC-Erie!

The biggest change that occurred at SHC-Erie during my tenure was the transition from a full time (24/7) hospital to an Ambulatory Surgery Center and Outpatient Specialty Care Center (9/5). This was a result of the fact that over 80% of the children treated at SHC-Erie involved same day (outpatient) procedures, and the inpatient procedures had a minimal number of nights at the hospital. Obviously, there were significant layoffs due to the elimination of positions which lead to employee anxiety and low morale. Over time, the employees came to understand the logic of going to our current model; we reduced our operating budget significantly and, more importantly, continued to treat an increasing number of children each year!

The last three years have been very fulfilling for me, starting with making a successful presentation in front of the Joint Boards in Tampa to reinstate our food service employees and maintain our food court at SHC-Erie. Other accomplishments included the staffing of the Director of Operations with Mary Jane Antoon, who also functions as our Director of Patient Care Services. My first mission as Chairman of the Board of Governors was to inform Headquarters of Mary Jane Antoon's job responsibilities and to get her salary adjusted appropriately. Not only did the salary get adjusted, her position was retitled to Administrator.

This last year the employees at SHC-Erie have distinguished our Shrine Hospital as the only hospital of all 22 that had 100 % employee participation in an independent hospital employee survey. Speech-Language Pathologist Joins Shriners Hospitals for Children – Erie

We communicate in many different ways – with speech, facial expressions, gestures and written words. Imagine what it would feel like to be unable to communicate basic needs and wants, make choices and interact socially. A person in this situation can often feel closed off from the world altogether. Speech-language therapy can give a child a way to communicate.

A Team Approach

At Shriners Hospitals for Children — Erie we take an interdisciplinary approach to care. As a team working with families, our goal is to help each child improve physically, emotionally and socially. Every child is evaluated by professionals who work together to coordinate the child's care. In keeping with that approach, we recently added a speech-language pathologist to our team.



Nicole Lewis joined the staff in July 2016. She has a bachelor's degree in communication disorders and sciences from the State University of New York at Geneseo and earned her master's degree in speechlanguage pathology with teacher certification from Ithaca College. Lewis also has a certificate of clinical

Lewis wanted to join the staff of Shriners Hospitals for Children — Erie because of the collaborative team approach to care. She said, "Working directly with a patient's occupational therapist and physical therapist really helps to open new doors and make progress with the patient's treatment."

Lewis believes that speech-language therapy goes handin-hand with occupational and physical therapies and "all three play a significant role in helping a child to grow in their physical and communicative abilities."

What is Speech Language Therapy?

Speech-language pathologists assess a patient's speech, language, cognition, feeding and swallowing functions to identify types of communication problems or swallowing disorders and develop a plan of care.

The goal is to find a way for the patients to communicate, which doesn't necessarily always mean verbally. Speechlanguage pathologists often look for alternative means of communication, such as sign language, eye-gaze assisting communication devices, computer tablets and even picture cards. These tools allow a patient to use other, non-verbal means, to communicate their thoughts, wants and needs.

Lewis said that speech-language pathology is important because it provides children with the language everyone should be able to have. "As a person, we should all be able to voice our opinion and get our thoughts out."
