#### FROM CHIEF RABBAN

For many of us, we view the activities of the Shriners strictly within the boundaries of our fraternal (the fun side) and the philanthropical (the Hospital side) and we rarely take the opportunity to look at ourselves outside of that box. However, there are times where we make a true impact on the lives of people in our surrounding communities that often goes either unnoticed or unpublished and we are non-the-wiser for it. In this case, I would like to report on some of the activities taken in regards to a small elementary school in need of help by some of the members of Moslem Shrine and our Ladies.

Shickler is a school that a group within FCA (aka Chrysler) "adopted" to help some of the families provide Christmas gifts for their Children. My wife, Michelle, who happens to be the current High Priestess for Za-Hir-U-Din Court 7, took over the coordination and distribution of items being donated for this school and has been the driving force to make sure it is not only successful, but that it gets better every year. The premise of this activity is quite simple – the school provides a list of those in need and the items that they would like to have in order to provide a "good" Christmas for their family and this group does whatever is necessary to make certain that the requests are filled. Personally, when I had the opportunity to review these lists, I was surprised to see a wide range of items from toys and clothes to laundry detergent and basic household supplies.

Last year, I was asked if there were any items that the Shrine may have had that we would be willing to donate to the school even if they were not strictly a conventional type of Christmas present. To fulfill that request, some of the leftover Shrine circus t-shirts and stuffed animals that were lining our hallways were taken up to the school by Michelle and I. The reactions of the school staff was overwhelming...

"We were able to give away every Shrine Circus t-shirt in the most entertaining way. One of our teachers read a circus book at our monthly reading assembly to the whole school. After the book, we sent out trivia questions for the whole school to answer. Teachers could either answer the questions together with their students (like most k-2 classes did) or have individual students answer questions. All of the t-shirts were gone by the end of the day - it was so cool! Not a day goes by that we don't see at least a handful of students wearing Shrine Circus t-shirts."

"We are so blessed by the FCA team and Shriners! You have truly shaped the culture of our building and have given to our community tenfold! Here is an update on how we are giving back to our community as well:"

e5/Kindergarten - partnering with Devonshire Retirement Village (working in the memory care unit on speaking, listening skills, and fine motor skill development)

1st grade - Just launched their Pennies for Patients campaign (collecting, counting, and sorting money for the Lymphoma Society)
2nd grade - Partnering with Karmanos Cancer Institute (making polar fleece cancer blankets for patients. Students visit monthly to comfort patients, sing songs, and play games) We were just informed by McLaren that they have given their last blanket away. We would be extremely

grateful for any polar fleece donations that FCA could send our way. Maybe potluck for polar fleece??

3rd & 4th grades - Partnering with McLaren Hospice (making 60-90 Sunshine bags filled with personal care items for hospice patients)
5th grade - Disability Awareness Day (April 6th -students share their knowledge of disabilities and run an awareness day for classmates)

"We have just counted all of the stuffed animals that you kindly donated. Currently, we are still planning on using them with kindergarten/preschool transition, but we are trying to also work them in to an ASL project. Some ideas we are bouncing around are birthday in a bag for foster care children, comfort bags for kids in crisis or in shelters, and first responder comfort items."

As you can see, we Shriners and our Ladies can help shape the lives of children in more ways than one. While our Philanthropy is still our driving force, there are little things that we can do to continue to have a lasting positive impact on the lives of those around us even though we will likely never meet them face to face. A child in need is just that, a child in need and if we can help, we are obligated to do so.

So, if there happens to be any of our Ladies, or Nobles for that matter, that may have some of the polar fleece material lying around that the school is asking for that you would like to donate, simply put it in my office and I will make certain that it gets there.

To add a little bit to one of Ill. Sir Bob Lee's idioms - "Moslem on the move" - can change the lives of those in need.

It truly is a Great Day To Be A Shriner!

#### Nobles:

As all of you know, 2018 will be my last year as Treasurer. It has been a "Very Interesting" ten years and I am proud to be a part of the long history of Moslem Shrine leadership. To assure that our Accounting/Financing well being continues to improve, it is of the upmost that your choice for my replacement must be of the highest personal and professional integrity. Personal politics and ambitions MUST be put aside for the good of the order. With this in mind I was asked to prepare a job description of the position of Temple Treasurer (below).

"It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to perform all the duties usually required of a corporate treasurer and a treasurer under Shrine Law, including the preparation and filing of all necessary federal, state, and local tax returns and payment of all required taxes following review and approval by the Divan and any outside public accountants employed by the Temple. The Treasurer shall receive from the Recorder all money paid into the Temple and shall deposit or cause to be deposited the same without delay to the credit of the Temple in such bank or trust company as the Divan shall direct. He shall keep a true and accurate account thereof, shall pay all bills for which a regular warrant has been drawn, authorized by the Divan, either through the budget or by special resolution. All payments, whether by check or otherwise, shall require the signature of at least two of the following officers: Potentate, Secretary, and Treasurer; He shall render to the Temple at the Business Session and at other times as the Divan may demand, a full statement of its financial condition, so far as his office is concerned. The Divan will employ an independent certified public accountant to audit the books and records of the Temple, including the reports of the Treasurer. The Treasurer is required to furnish a surety bond sufficient to cover the risk to the Temple of their respective offices, the expenses for which shall be paid by the Temple."


Scott Clark, the Unit Director and bass drum player, was introduced to this instrument 19 years ago by his Scottish neighbor. He liked it enough that he took lessons from Bruce Burt, a known talent in the piping world. Scott plays both bass drum and bag pipes and through Bruce, played with the Red Thistle Pipes band which once opened for Rod Stewart! Scott knew of the Detroit Shrine Highlanders Unit and heard they needed a bass drummer. On his way to becoming a Mason, he was able to perform with the Highlanders Pipes & Drums. Fast forward to 2007, when he became a Moslem Shriner and his wife Pam, became a member of L.O.S.

This active unit is called upon to play for Shrine events during the year as well as participate in parades throughout Southeast Michigan. The 30 unit members meet every Tuesday to practice and share performance duties for functions and events

As a Shriner, Scott also serves the Temple by working the Sportsman's Raffles, circuses, Charity Hockey game and other events. He enjoys his time with this organization and he keeps in mind the primary purpose of the brotherhood. "I was in Mexico visiting Legoland and a boy came up to thank me. He spoke Spanish so someone had to translate for him. He said his brother had been in the Shriners Hospital for Children in Mexico City and he wanted to thank him for all the Shriners had done to help him." said Scott. During the same visit, a girl working in Legoland ran up and hugged Scott as a big "thank you". She also had been a patient at the Shriners Hospital for Children and her treatment there has allowed her to walk and live a normal life.

If you have a desire to don a kilt and make some music but you aren't sure you measure up to The Highlanders, Scott offers this advice: "It'll take a while, perhaps 2 years, to get up to speed but stick with it. We have a good teacher who is an open piper (highest level), just give it time."

If you've ever heard Mr. Harold Lanning, the Detroit Shrine Chanter sing, you'll know **that** is his credo. At 91 years of age, his tonality and vigor are impressive and his credentials are astounding. Prior to joining the Detroit Shrine Chanter Unit in 1989, Harold had the opportunity to sing with many great names. Enlisted in the U.S. Army in 1944 he was trained in the Infantry and found himself in Hawaii assigned to the Special Service Entertainment Branch. He performed with the late Allen Ludden (married to Betty White) who was also his commanding officer. Carl Reiner; comedian, actor, director, and writer was assigned to the SSEB and along with Harold and the other entertainers, performed in USO Shows in the Pacific Rim. He's shaken Irving Berlin's hand and performed for countless dignitaries both in the army and as a civilian.

Singing has been Harold's life. His first onstage stint began when he was 3 years old which was also when he began playing piano. Since then, he has been asked to sing at so many events there is not enough room to list them all. Some performances include: Comerica Park, Novi Civic Center, GM and many Shriner occasions. Harold recalls one of the highlights of his singing career that recently occurred, "When I was 90 I was asked to sing Happy Birthday to honor the 90<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Shriners Hospital for Children in Erie, Pa. That was a wonderful experience."

In spite of having such a vivid life Harold says "I had always wanted to be a Shriner because of the fun they have and the good they do. I've been a Mason for 70 years and a Shriner for 29 years." He's the Unit Director of the Chanters and the only member at this time (maybe because it would be nearly impossible to keep up with his pace). He also has been a driver for Child Care and a member of the Jesters. Harold takes his role as Shriner seriously and has sponsored 3 girls who needed care from the Shriners Hospital for Children. Harold's son, Michael, also has a big Shriner heart. He followed in his father's footsteps and was a Chanter with the Sahib Shrine Temple in Sarasota, FL. When Moslem Shriner Hartley Lenover had an aneurysm and required 24/7 care, Michael stepped in to help. Though Hartley's wife Nancy, was faithfully at his side, she needed more assistance. Michael has been of service for 23 years so far - true Shriner dedication to his "family". Blessed with 3 sons, 2 daughters, 14 grandchildren and 16 great grandchildren, Harold has it all and he's doing it all. He stays active singing in 2 church choirs, participating in an annual children's choir camp with 100 kids and of course, regular singing gigs. He said, "When I retired from GM 31 years ago, I prayed to God that I be able to still play softball (he stopped playing only a few years ago) and that he still let me sing." 
#### **MOTOR CITY SHINERS**

#### FROM ORIENTAL GUIDE

Going forward, I will need to find 2 or 3 Nobles to be responsible for and transition specific portions of the raffles. I will continue do some of the work and to oversee the global process. This way, no one person takes on too much or is uncomfortable with the task at hand. I will work with the Nobles during the next couple raffles and train them as needed. In time, if a Noble proves himself capable and willing, I will feel comfortable in passing the flame over to him as Raffle Chairman if given the blessing by our Potentate. No matter how the process plays out, I will always be available to assist, advise, lead if necessary and make sure these important events remain a viable and sustainable fundraising option for Moslem. There are no visitations scheduled at the present time.


Reminder that those that have not paid their Past Master dues for 2018 that they should get their dues in as soon as possible.

#### FROM THE DESK OF THE RECORDER

From the Bylaws of Shriners International and Moslem Shriners

ARTICLE25, Section 325.11

Election Regulations.

- (a) **Electioneering.** A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple my print, publish and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a resume consisting of the of his educational background, his vocational history and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble, or group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited.
- (b) **Expenditures Prohibited.** The expenditure of money for gifts, favor or entertainment of behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.
- (c) **Violation.** For any violation of (a) or (b), the Imperial Potentate may suspend ay offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.
- (d) **Notice.** At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election, the temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section.

**ADDITIONAL NOTICE:** Appointments by a Potentate are for one year only. It is customary and expected that each committee chairman or noble holding an appointed will tender his resignation to the Potentate at the end of the calendar year.
