

Cover Story



Fall 2017 Class Honoree: Jack Hansen PP

Being chosen by the reigning Potentate to be the Class Honoree is indeed, a true honor. There are many nobles who've accomplished much in the name of the Shriner organization but to be named the Class Honoree; that requires "something extra" and Jack Hansen has it.

Jack Hansen is a Past Potentate (2004) and has been a Moslem Shriner for 35 years. During that time he has held many positions: Circus Staff, Reception, Special Events, Past Director of the Jesters and Past President of the JOM. Hansen is currently the Chief Aide to Illustrious Sir, Shrine Club Coordinator and The Americans Unit Director.

He went down the Shriner path because his uncle, a Shriner, asked Jack's father (also named Jack) to come to a Shriner meeting. Jack Sr. asked Jack Jr. to join him at that meeting and as Jack said, "I went with him and I never looked back". You can say the Shriners are a Hansen family affair because Jack's brother, Robert, is also a Shriner. Jack's mother Virginia, was the treasurer for Ladies Oriental Shrine (LOS). His sister Victoria was the LOS High Priestess 2002-03 and is currently the Queen of Daughters of the Nile - Detroit Chapter. Hansen's other sister Barbara, became High Priestess of LOS the same year Jack became Potentate in 2004. Jack's year as potentate was the first year for the Moslem Temple's new location in Southfield, MI. Prior to the move, the Moslem Temple held their meetings at The Masonic Temple in Detroit.

Jack's career as a Detroit fireman began in 1989 and again, his father led the way. Jack Sr. retired as Battalion Chief 6 after 36 years of service, however his son chose firefighting for other reasons. Although Jack wanted to help people, he also really appreciated the job's schedule. As a Detroit firefighter, one works nine 24-hr days per month. Work a day, 3 days off, work a day, 3 days off; that sequence is followed two more times with a final run of 5 days on. As enticing as it sounds, Jack said "There were many nights I didn't get to see that bed". Most importantly, his firefighter schedule allowed Jack to be there for his kids. Jack and his wife had alternating schedules that allowed one of them to always be present with their children.

As a fireman he's had opportunity to connect children in need with the Shriner's Hospital for Children.

About 15 years ago, a young local girl whose house had been fire-bombed was sent to Receiving

Hospital. The family was notified that Shriners Hospital for Children in Cincinnati would be able to take
care of her burns at no cost to the family. Two hours later, a Lear jet was waiting for her at City Airport
to fly her to Cincinnati. A notable fact about Shriners Hospital for Children – Cincinnati is that during the
September 9/11 attacks, the hospital (which has a state-of-the-art burn unit) opened its doors to all
burn victims from the attacks. Children, civilians, First Responders, public servants; all were welcome.



Regrowth in Detroit

Still stationed in Detroit at Engine 23 Squad 3, Hansen sees the development in downtown Detroit and believes the city is coming back. "I think the city is much safer now. You shouldn't be scared to walk down there; there are undercover officers and you wouldn't even know it. There is security everywhere because of the casinos and increased traffic. They're also doing development as far out as Eastern Market and they're planning to put canals around the greenhouses downtown."

Being a Shriner Is Life Changing

Clearly being the Potentate for such a recognizable organization has been a major highlight of Jack's life but in all honesty, he says he truly enjoys just being a Shriner. "I really like meeting people from a range of backgrounds. Plumbers, lawyers, Carpenters, store owners – so many different people but when you are a Shriner, you are all equal. My concern is that membership is dwindling because the younger generation has different demands on their time. There are big time stressors on family: both parents working, after-school sports, homework – schedules are busy" says Jack.

In spite of the hectic schedules, Hansen still feels that becoming a part of something bigger is more important. His advice to perspective members: "Get your kids involved. My kids grew up in the Shrine. If they didn't show up people would ask 'Why aren't your kids here?' They were world travelers at the ages of 9 and 13 because of my involvement with the Shrine – from Alaska to Cancun, they went everywhere with me. People ask if it's a problem to bring their kids and I always encourage them to bring them."

Multiple generations of the Hansen family have been steeped in Shriner tradition and its Jack's desire to bring that experience to other families. That is the "something extra" that makes Jack Hansen deserving of Fall 2017 Class Honoree.

Secretary or Director know and again, the Unit will cover the cost.

We still have gold and silver Shrine Fez pins, so sell them if you can. Call your director at 248-828-4151 and he will mail them to you.

We have a box of (60) Calendars to sell for the Shrine so pick them up at the meeting or call George ant he will mail them to you.

If you are not receiving any notification of meetings, call Director George.

If you know of any of our members that are not doing very well, let your director know and he can send them a card and give them a call.

Brothers, there has been some question on the Unit Subsidies, so here is the Motion:
