A LETTER FROM OUR POTENTATE

We are working hard to develop new events for the 2nd and 4th quarters that stabilize our revenue stream over the year. In doing this, we have moved away from asking our Shriners to buy tickets to this or that to support our Shrine. In exchange, I ask for some of your time, time to work at our events, meet your Shrine family and support our Temple through contribution of time.

We can be optimistic for the future as we have turned a corner. We have replaced old income streams with new, productive events; events that get us out in the public eye. Hopefully, people will notice us and some may say... hey, I'd like to be a Shriner. We have 2 very high profile events and we are adding more for his very reason, to improve our income and to present the best fraternity in the world to the public in an effort to get them to join us. We are going to work very hard to instill a positive mental attitude within this Temple and shoot down the nay sayers. So, what is our mission this year? Where do we want to be in December 2017. With a clear mission and plan we will achieve our goals. So, here is what I see as our mission for this year.

1. Continue our **profit improvement** for 2016, by adding 2 more events that bring in outside funds.
2. **Stabilize our budget** for the long terms with events that generate a surplus for our Temple each year, by improving our existing events and creating new ones that generate additional revenue for our Temple.
3. Place our Shrine Creed up on the wall and attempt to live up to its meaning in action and words. **Live up to our creed** and our Temple will be a better place and we will be better men.
4. **Improve our facilities** for our main income producer Silver Gardens to support goals 1 and 2. Update our facilities for our customers. Silver Gardens generates \$300,000 each year that pays for the majority of our lights, heat, insurance and taxes. We have to keep this facility looking fresh and vibrant. It has been 7 years since we have given it a facelift.
5. Improve our home for our units and Nobles so that its an enjoyable place to be by being creative in our use of space, implementing new **programs to help units improve** and renovating existing facilities to create a better environment
6. Improve our product, that is, **improve what we offer to new members** and our current Nobles. We have to offer something of value to everyone. What is our product? A fraternity of like minded Brothers striving to create a better life for our Shrine kids and maintain a friendship and bonds with our Brothers.
7. **Create events that are fun**, provide value and are entertaining to everyone involved by entertaining our Nobles, providing a sense of pride of ownership in our events and providing access to families to enjoy the events we host.
8. **Improve Nobility participation** by reengaging Nobles who are no longer active, , creating events that people want to participate in because they enjoy it, making sure our Nobles want to be part of all that we do and understand why we do what we do and how it aids our Temple.
9. **Change and improve how we conduct business.** Be creative in what we do, proactive in our actions, plan and execute to achieve our goals. We are doing this. We are changing how we conduct business. We are instituting an Operations Manual by which our business affairs will be conducted. This is a definitive guideline on accounting procedures, budgeting and operations.
10. **Improve communication** to our Nobility about events and happenings at our Temple to keep everyone engaged in what we do. We are installing a 24 hour call in line with all the upcoming events. Monthly we will be able to call out to all our Nobles with upcoming events. And, lastly, the Moslemite will be out within the first 5 days of each month.

Can we achieve all of these goals? I would think so since many of them have been in process for over 4 months now. We are well on our way to bringing a lot of them to completion within the first quarter. They are not new or recently created. We have been working on these goals for quite some time.

What else are we changing? We are elevating our Unit Directors as acting managers of our Temple and its operations. As we go through the year, the Unit Directors will be our first line of communication back to our Units. The Directors will hear it from our Divan before anyone else does. It will be their job to take information provided by the Divan back to their members. All Directors will be held to act at all times in the best interests of this Temple. No less than I expect from all members of this Divan, my staff and our Nobility. It starts from the top down, leadership and accountability.

We have a great Divan, of committed members, that have worked hard these past few years to improve our Temple. I am committed to continuing this progress. I ask our Nobility to help us. I ask our Nobles to volunteer at an event. Give us a hand in running our events. Come to business meetings and tell us what you would like to see and how we, together, can improve our Temple. I have a vision and a plan for where we will be on December 31, 2016. I ask everyone to assist me in achieving these goals for the betterment of all our Nobles. Long after I am gone, I would hope that some where, some place, some one in remembrance says, yep, 2016, that was a pretty good year for our Temple.

As I look back on 2015 I have seen a number of changes moving from old to new at Moslem Shrine Temple. Moving from our old accounting system of Peach Tree to our new accounting system of Quick Books. This change will our staff to provide better and quicker

accounting of Moslem's fundraisers, investments, and assets.

Moving from our old membership computer program operated by Shriners International known as Red Fez to our new membership computer program operated by Shriners International known as Web Fez. This new system will give the ability to aid additional information about our members, such as what Unit or club do they belong to, fund raising activities, top line signers, awards received and many over items which we were unable to have before, which meant some questions about a Noble we were not able to answer. The new system also allows the Temple to have contact with headquarters in Tampa and Shriners Hospitals for Children, as well many other informational and programs that the old system did not have. There are still a few bugs to work out, but it is getting there.

Moving out of our old transportation garage, which has served us well, to a new transportation garage. No move is ever easy, but I believe the new transportation garage will serve as well as the old one did.

Moving from some, not all, of the methods of raising funds to new ways of raising funds, other than from our Nobles. Moving from our old (present) circus using a tent to a new facility a couple of years which will allow Moslem to provide what our customers deserve in February/March time of the year.

Moving from a number of our older hospitals in our system to new medical facilities around North America. We have the greatest gift that any person or group can give to children and their family: Love to the Rescue.

Moving from old method of public relations to our new method of public relations with radio with the Pennies for Power Program, TV and radio with the Michigan State Fair, expansion of commercials on TV and radio by Shriners Hospitals for Children.

Shriners International moving away from some older traditions, for good or bad, to new like requesting of more involvement our the ladies at Ceremonials.

As we move away from the old relationships with the other Masonic Bodies and move forward to new relationships like Brotherhood, sharing and stronger relationships with those same Masonic Bodies, youth groups and Grand Lodge.

This can truly be an exciting time as we can see, as well be part of, the rebirth of Shrinedom. As we work to make Shrinedom the fraternity of choice that men want to join and their ladies want to share Shrinedom with their husbands.

I'm truly excited for what I see and look forward to a bright future for Shrinedom and Shriners Hospitals for Children.

Brother Nobles:

Reflecting over the last seven years, I believe the term "We come a long way, baby" is VERY appropriate. In the past, we only had two main outside revenue sources, our Circus (2nd Quarter of the calendar year) and the Summer Gun Raffle (3rd Quarter of calendar year). Although these

events brought in much needed cash flow, they left one half year without any significant outside cash flow, giving us a considerable problem paying our bills on a timely basis.

We have in 2012, added for additional external inflow of cash, the State Fair in the 3rd Quarter. In 2015 we added the second Winter Gun Raffle to the 1st Quarter. And this year 2016 we are adding the Christmas Spectacular to the 4th Quarter. Not only do these actions give us much needed outside cash flow, but also the timing of these cash inflows is spread throughout the year.

On the other side of the coin, we have accomplished many means of containing costs during the year. One of the most dramatic was the reduction of the property taxes by half on our Shrine Center in Southfield. Other points of reduction in operating costs are ongoing improvements in the efficiency

of the heat/cooling systems in the Shrine Center, more effective internal lighting, an upgrade in our communication systems (phone, cable television, internet connection), relocation of our garage to Clawson Michigan, and numerous improvements in maintaining our Shrine Center in Southfield Michigan (Roof repair, Plumbing, Waste removal, Sidewalks/parking lots, Grounds, Security systems, and Wi-Fi).

Also we have improved our Accounting/Finance systems over the years. Along with the upgrade of the computers, we have converted from Peachtree Accounting to QuickBooks Accounting system giving us additional capacity to maintain financial data in a more efficient manner. The payroll system has been outsourced to maintain more security and effectiveness. Streamlining in office procedures has allowed our office staff to become more efficient and effective.

There also has been a seamless transition in the office staff. Other changes have been in our banking services supplier and investment advisors (Chase to 5/3 bank). We have, in addition, added a Line of Credit to help us to be able to control our cash flow timing problems.

To sum it up we are on our way to become "MIGHTY MOSLEM" once again!!!

Instrument Donations

This past month in cleaning out our old garage in preparation for moving to our new facility located in Clawson, several old band instruments were discovered. News from Cincinnati

Cincinnati Shriners Patient #65 Fulfills His Dreams

On May 20, 1965, William Joe Culp bit into an electrical cord causing massive destruction of his upper lip, mouth, and nose, parts of his face and around his left eye. At 1-1/2 years old, his parents rushed him to the local hospital emergency room.

Thankfully for Culp, the Aladdin Shrine Temple from his home town in Steubenville, Ohio, heard about the accident and stepped in to help. They sponsored Culp as a patient to get treatment at Shriners Hospitals for Children®—Cincinnati, a new hospital specializing in pediatric burn care.

In 1965, Shriners Hospitals for Children—Cincinnati was located in a small area in University Hospital, while plans to build a freestanding hospital dedicated to pediatric burn care were underway.

Culp's patient number was 65, which made him the 65th patient in Cincinnati Shriners Hospital history.

He spent the next 14 years returning to visiting Shriners Hospitals for Children—Cincinnati for care. Culp had more than 30 different surgeries over that time to correct the function and cosmetic defects on his face as a result of his severe burn injuries.

"I still remember how wonderful everyone was in my time at Shriners," said Culp. "One particular nurse I will never forget is Gayle Mahler. She had a huge impact on my life and how I dealt with my appearance and injuries."

At age 11, Culp remembers having two goals in life; obtain a mechanical engineering degree and to one day become a Shriner. He finished college and became a mechanical engineer in his early 20's.

Culp is now 52 and recently became a Shriner at Omar Temple. He said the main reason for fulfilling this goal was to help children the way the Shriners helped him. He currently lives in South Carolina with his wife of 26 years and has three boys ages 20, 22 and 24.

Once he became a Shriner, he had a strong urge to visit Shriners Hospitals for Children—Cincinnati. He wanted to see what the hospital was like today and relive some of the positive memories he had held onto all of these years.

Culp was happily surprised with how different the facility is today. Luckily for Culp, one of his tour guides, Vicki Keehan, remembers Gayle and several other employees that were here when Culp was a patient. Vicki has worked for Shriners 37 years and was very gracious to take the time to show Culp around and reminisce with him.
