Who's Your Brother?

Brother Jim Gotts, now 68 years young, is one of those rare birds that come around only once in a great while. He has accomplished a whole lot in his life so far, and seems to have a lot more things going strong - both for his and for our futures. He has been a military man, a community leader, a star athlete, a coach, a business owner and consultant, a committed Shriner, and most importantly, a proud parent and grandparent of a batch of successful kids and grandkids.

Jim and wife Patricia live on a nice water front home on Lake Sherwood in Commerce Township. Jim stays super busy with his many commitments. Patricia is retired from her family's audio-video business. They and their grandkids stay busy and happy with their pontoon boat and all of their beach and water toys. Together, Jim and Patricia have five kids, all grown with families and solid careers of their own. They also share seven grandkids, plus one more on the way. Daughter Victoria and husband Larry currently reside in Hong Kong. Victoria is an attorney there and Larry manages Asian-Rim Operations for a major international bank. Son Gary and wife Aimee own and operate Indigo Bluffs RV Park in Glen Arbor, near the Sleeping Bear Dunes. They have been blessed with four fine, active boys; that being Collin, Bryce, Evan and Gannon. Gary also played on the Notre Dame U. hockey team. Daughter Debbie is an insurance executive and her husband Ken is golf pro. (Unfortunately, Ken apparently can't do much to help Jim's golf game(?). They live in Lowell with granddaughter Alexis and grandson Tyler, who just won a junior golf championship. Son Jimmy and wife Kelly live in West Bloomfield, along with granddaughter Ashley. Jimmy owns and operates a dental lab and Kelly is an administrator for Walled Lake Consolidated Schools. Bryan is the youngest of the crew, and is a home builder. Wife Jenny is a counselor and psychologist for Farmington Schools. They are happily expecting in May. Jim was also involved with the Walled Lake school system in the role of a Director for the "Foundation for Excellence". This group works with the schools and the local business community to find funding sources for non-budgeted, but worthwhile student scholastic opportunities.

Jim has had quite an athletic career. He grew up in northwest Detroit and, after playing several sports at Redford St. Mary and Junior Hockey with the Teamsters, he won a full football scholarship to UCLA, way out in sunny southern California. He played at a starter level at fullback and linebacker, winning varsity football letters for each of his four years on the team. They beat that awesome Michigan State team in the 1966 Rose Bowl, (This was the MSU squad that was later rated as one of the best teams of the 20th century, with Bubba Smith, Gene Washington, et al.) Jim's military career took a good chunk out of his pro football opportunities, but he was still able to play for a couple of years with the St. Louis Cardinals in the NFL. In his spare time out in L.A., he pitched on the varsity baseball team, earning three more letters. So all-in-all, he is a UCLA Bruin seven letter man. That's quite an accomplishment! He later coached football in our area for about fifteen years at various levels. Jim says he most enjoyed working with the middle school kids, who could be molded into better players and even better people. In his years at Walled Lake, they had an average of 160 kids turn out for the team each year. No one was cut - they all made the team and all played to some

extent. During those years, their team's record was 133 wins, 1 loss and 1 tie! Wow! He says that he had contact way back then with our very own Hal Henderson, who is a member of the Michigan High School Coaches Hall-of-Fame

Jim had a distinguished military career. He was an officer in the U.S. Naval Reserves while in college, and after graduation, moved to active duty in our Navy where he gradually rose to the rank of Commander. (For those of us from our other military branches, this is a Lt. Colonel level.) He rotated as a Line Officer at Yankee Station, which was a naval and air combat operation in Vietnam's Gulf of Tonkin. The Navy fondly referred to this "Task Force 77" operation as the "Tonkin Gulf Yacht Club". There may be some truth to that "Club" nickname because anyone who served in the NAM war-zone sure did "pay his dues"!

In 1971, after his active military career, Jim moved into the insurance industry to support his growing family. He started and ran his own insurance agency and sold it in 2005 to the Ralph Wilson Insurance Group. He is now the Director of Risk Management for Wilson's company. (Get the connection – Ralph Wilson owns the Buffalo Bills. Guess you just can't take the football out of the man!) Jim brings his risk management expertise to our Shine as Moslem Temple's Risk Management Coordinator and is also an advisor to our Imperial Shrine insurance operations in Tampa.

Jim joined the Masons in our Commerce Lodge 121 in 1991, and then joined Moslem Temple in 1992. Since then he has cut quite a trial. He is a Motor Corps Vet, a very active member of the Director's Staff and a leader in our highly respected Legion of Honor, in addition to several other affiliated groups, such as the Jesters, the Hajj and so on. He and our newest Oriental Guide, Craig Stigleman, chair our Silver Gardens Commercial Oversight Committee. Their role is to oversee, guide and counsel the Silver Garden's management staff and act as liaison between Silver Gardens and our Divan and the Nobility at large. Jim said the first Noble that he really met was Bill Shaffmaster. You can't get any better of an intro to the goodness of our fraternity than by getting to know Mr. Bill! Jim also brought Casey Jones, Craig Stigleman, Tim Lancaster and Joe Merem into our Temple and then into our Director's Staff. Jim and this highly contributing motley crew are justifiably known as our very own "Rat Pack".

Out in the community, Jim is on three advisory boards at Henry Ford Hospital. They are the "Brain Trust" (neurological); "Shoot for a Cure" (funding and philanthropic); and the Edith and Benson Ford Heart and Vascular Institute. This latter group is designed to be similar to the operations of the Mayo and Cleveland Clinics. On these three boards, Jim is an advisor in the areas of health care management, insurance, philanthropy and marketing. He also chairs the Commerce Township Downtown Development Authority. They recently developed a \$160 Million, 336 acre property with ponds and trails and also made it the current home of the Commerce Town Hall and Library. They also installed the world's largest roundabout on Martin Parkway at the terminus of M-5. Jim and good buddy Craig were also key players who were intimately and actively involved in restarting the highly successful Great Lakes State Fair in Novi this year. This has been a huge boost to the prestige of Moslem, not to mention a buck or two in income

Even with his many life successes, Jim is somewhat of a low-key, but very intense guy. He stays slightly in the background but one can easily see that he is playing a major role in helping lead us to a better future. His personal goal in whatever job he seriously undertakes is to work very hard at it to make a positive difference. We can definitely see that he is living up to this high standard in his Moslem Temple commitments. Jim - Thanks for being one of us and for really "making a difference" in our Shrine operations; and, most importantly, *THANKS for your service to our country!*



Sept. 25th – Clinton Parade.



What's New in Erie!

Erie Gives – Syria and Osiris Top Donors

For the second year in a row, the largest donation made to any non-profit during Erie Gives Day was from Syria Shriners in Pittsburgh, PA in the amount of \$103,000.

This generous gift, along with others including a \$52,000 donation from Osiris Shriners in Wheeling, WV helped us finish second among the non-profit participants again this year.

Shriners Hospitals for Children — Erie received it's match from the Erie Community Foundation on Friday, August 26. The total amount raised was \$241,173.
