

Sean English the Journey Continues

Mitch Albom article of May 6, 2018

I lost my leg ... I didn't lose my life'

There are a lot of ways you can go after an event like that. Bitterness is one. Depression is another. Anger. Self-doubt. Questioning God or the universe.

Sean English, who was a track star at U-D Jesuit, never attached to any of those. Instead, he remembers an air of positivity beginning to settle over him as he lay in the hospital, even amidst six surgeries to repair a broken pelvis, broken legs, and to amputate his right leg below the knee.

"I just remember sitting in the hospital room and hearing the news of Dr. Ray's death," he recalls. "Every day I just remember her name and what she gave, which was the ultimate sacrifice — her life — to do what she was doing for a living, which was helping others. I always keep that in the back of my head.

"Sure, you could say I lost my leg," he adds, "but you could also say I didn't lose my life."

Instead, he reconstructed his high school existence one-step at a time, with some new elements. Grueling rehab, five times a week. A prosthetic leg, which took time to get used to. A new girlfriend, who helped him on his journey.

He eventually returned to school. In April he attended, the sentencing of the young man who changed his life, Keith Martin, who, a week before his sentencing, was caught drinking beer in his car outside a casino, a violation of his probation.

Despite that, despite all he had gone through, despite the six- to 12-year sentence a judge ordered for Martin, English said he forgave the young man. He said he was pulling for him. He said, "I'm in your corner...I'm really rooting for you."

And a month later, last Wednesday, here was Sean English, whose father, he says, once qualified for the Olympic track trials, lining up for one last 400-meter race for his high school.

"I always told everyone I'd be back on the track," he says. "But I didn't know when."

Wearing his father's old high school jersey, Sean embarked on his lap. Halfway through, the pain was significant. He wasn't sure he would make it. But with the cheers of his family and his high school teammates urging him on, he came around another curve of life, this time with a more glorious finish. He fell into his parents' embrace, shedding tears. He told his father, "I did it."

Sean English the Journey Continues

For me to be out there meant the world to me," says the Purdue-bound senior. "And to do what I actually wanted to do, finish, meant even more."

The next day, Sean went to his prom.

Thirteen months after nearly dying on the side of the road? A new leg? A track race? A prom?

Do we ever truly appreciate the resilience of the human spirit?

An unintended commencement speech

I said that I had heard the best commencement speech of the year. It came by accident, when I asked Sean to reflect on what had happened, and what he would say to all the people out there if given a chance.

Here is what he said. Imagine it; perhaps, being spoken before a football field's worth of young, impressionable graduates:

"The accident I had completely reshaped my outlook on life. It strengthened my faith and me as a human being. I now cherish every moment.

"I had a metamorphous...And Dr. Cynthia Ray's name now carries me along...

"I think about that accident often. But I never think about why did I stop? Or should I have kept driving? I think about, OK, that could have been my girlfriend in that (turned-over) car, or my grandma, or my mom, it could have been someone very important to me. And the guilt that I would have had for the rest of my life if I had just driven by when I could have done something would have outweighed any physical pain that I've had to deal with.

"So I would rather do what I did, and lose my leg, than to live with that guilt...

"I mean, life can always be worse. You can go to your local hospital and see people in positions much worse than what you're experiencing. So you should always remember to be grateful for that.

"Also, life is way too short to hold grudges. That brother that you haven't been talking to for years, or that friend that you don't talk to anymore because you had a falling out, honestly, life is way too short and you never know when it's going to be taken away. You should never leave a (bad) conversation with a question of 'was that the last conversation I'll ever have with that person?...

"I know all this is easier said than done, but those are the kind of things that I hold onto now, and will for the rest of my life. And I hope everyone else can as well."

That's a speech. That's a life lesson. Sean English will not speak at his high school graduation. ("The valedictorians do that," he jokes. "I didn't get one of those spots.") But that's OK.

Sometimes the best lessons at a high school graduation don't come from the podium. Sometimes they are sitting in the stands, just grateful to be there.

As a member of this elite group, Larry is in the position to help chart the course for Shrine Centers worldwide.

Understanding the underpinnings of Shriners International are the best way to strengthen the foundation of each temple and for the Moslem Shriners, it is especially important since Larry Leib will be the Imperial Potentate during 2026-2027. This esteemed position showcases the home temple of the Imperial Potentate and thus, the Moslem Shriners become even more elevated as Larry moves up the ranks.

Fraternity and Philanthropy

There are actually two major corporations that are operating under the Shriners International umbrella: Shriners International and Shriners Hospitals for Children. Shriners International was founded in 1872 by 13 Masons who met weekly to create an organization that was fun and less restrictive than the Masonic Lodge. In 1922, the philanthropic arm was created in response to the huge polio epidemic. The first Shriners Hospital was built in Shreveport, Louisiana and for the next 30 years, the primary focus of Shriners Hospital for Children was to fight polio. Almost 100 years later, there are 22 hospitals in 3 countries with 20 of the hospitals residing in the United States. In the last 10 years, Shriners International has built outreach clinics in a number of locations with notable growth in the Philippines and Central America. They are now looking to expand treatment to children in the Far East.

At the local temple level, if there is a fraternal issue like membership; then it is directed to Shriners International. If there is an issue pertaining to pediatrics, burns or anything treated by our hospitals, then the issue is sent up to Shriners Hospital for Children.

Imperial Session

The Annual Imperial Session is actually an assembly of both corporations meeting simultaneously. There are International delegates and Hospital delegates that come together and meet at the same time. Issues are discussed and voted on by their respective delegates. Usually the Shriners International representatives are also Hospital representatives but Hospital representatives are not normally International representatives, they are typically Past Potentates and people who've been given the distinction of Hospital representative.



So what is the importance of this gathering to the general Nobility? This is the one time each year to meet and talk with all members of Imperial leadership, as well as nobility from all temples. This opportunity is akin to going to an event that Warren Buffet and Bill Gates are attending and being able to have a conversation with them. While Nobles are attending legislative meetings, their Ladies are attending LOS and Daughters of the Nile luncheons. Since family is one of the Shriner core values, this week long event is also filled with many family-friendly events so the whole gang has numerous entertainment venues to enjoy.

The Long Climb

Imperial Sir Larry is in line for the high honor of being Imperial Potentate – his desire for improving the circumstances of children who need help and his time with the Moslem Shriners have prepared him for exactly this. Says Larry "I knew I wanted to run for the Imperial Divan when I was on the Moslem Divan but I wanted to keep my focus on our temple until my kids got older and I had accomplished what I set out to accomplish during my year (2015) as Potentate. Then the timing became right for running for Imperial Outer Guard in the Imperial Divan." When asked why becoming Imperial Potentate is important to Leib, he responded "The real reason is that I want to help kids. I have a passion for helping Shrine kids. The nine years I served on the hospital board in Chicago changed my whole outlook on life. I thought as I got more involved, I could have a bigger impact."

"I have my own kids; my daughter Caitlin is 16 and my son Jenner is 14. They've grown up in the Shrine and they understand what it's all about. My kids understand that they're very fortunate: they are healthy, go to good schools, get great grades, and they have parents who care very much about them. Shrine kids don't have all of those same opportunities and it's up to us to help them get there." He goes on to tell a story about having breakfast with his children a year and a half ago. Larry was wearing a Shriners Hospital for Children shirt from Chicago. A gentleman walked by the table with his daughter, who was about the age of Leib's daughter, and he said to her 'If you ever see anyone wearing one of those shirts or wearing a red fez, be sure to thank them because I wouldn't be walking if it wasn't for them."" Larry said that experience had an impact on his daughter because it brought the Shriner's philanthropy home for her. It really highlighted the importance of being a Shriner because it was an outsider who was saying: I don't know you and I don't know your dad but he's involved with a group that really helped me.

Moslem Temple has always been viewed as a unique organization. It created the first Shrine Circus, implemented the first Director's Staff Unit, is located in a major metropolitan area and has a long history. With Larry Leib on the Imperial Divan, the spotlight is about to get more intense so *hang* on to your fez.

Hello Nobles Water and Fire Safety Facts

We as Shriners care very much about the safety and welfare of children I thought a few facts on preventable Accidents that can happen to a child, would make us help prevent these injuries from occurring.

Facts about Swimming Pool Drowning Accidents

The National Safety Council reports: The National Safety Council reports. There are over 7,000 drowning deaths nationally There are over 7,000 drowning deaths nationally each year. Drowning accidents are the leading cause of death and injury of children under 5 years of age. Drowning is the second leading cause of injury he second leading cause of injury-related death among children under the related death among children under the age of 15. (U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention) Nationwide, about 250 children under the age of 5 drown each year. Most of those incidents occur in backyard pools and studies have incidents occur in backyard pools and studies have shown that usually an adult is nearby, but not watching the child when they fell in the pool. A swimming pool is 14 times more likely than a motor vehicle to be involved in the death r vehicle to be involved in the death of a child age 4 and under. (Orange County California Fire Authority). Research shows that greater than 80% of pediatric campfire injuries are from day-old campfires. Unfortunately, smoldering coals, ash and embers can stay hot enough to cause burns for up to 24 hours. Children and parents don't recognize the dangers old campfires or cooking areas present. In fact, one study found that almost 90 percent of these types of injuries occurred while the child was being directly observed. Deep thermal injuries can occur quickly with less than one second of contact. Toddlers and pre-school aged children were most commonly affected when they fell, walked or crawled onto coals, embers or ash. As you would expect, the most frequently burned areas of the body were hands, forearms, and feet. Deep burn injuries to these areas are very difficult to manage and often require surgery, skin grafting and prolonged physical therapy. So when you and your Family are out in the back yard our out camping make sure to pay attention and please be careful. Frank Dougherty Director of Childcare 2018
