Sweetwater Shrine Club Search: Famous Shriners

In 1870 a group of Masons gathered frequently for lunch at the Knickerbocker Cottage on Sixth Avenue in New York City. At a special table on the second floor a particularly fun-loving group of men met regularly. Among the regulars were Walter M. Fleming, M.D. and William J. "Billy" Florence, an actor. The group frequently talked about starting a new fraternity for Masons – one centered on fun and fellowship, more than ritual. Fleming and Florence took this idea seriously enough to do something about it.

Billy Florence had been on tour in France, and had been invited to a party given by an Arabian diplomat. The exotic style, flavors and music of the Arabian-themed party inspired him to suggest this as a theme for the new fraternity. Walter Fleming, a devoted fraternity brother, built on Fleming's ideas and used his knowledge of fraternal ritual to transform the Arabian theme into the Ancient Arabic Order of the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine (A.A.O.N.M.S.).

With the help of the Knickerbocker Cottage regulars, Fleming drafted the ritual, designed the emblem and costumes, formulated a salutation and declared that members would wear the red fez.

The first meeting of Mecca Shriners, the first temple (chapter) established in the United States, was held September 26, 1872. As word got out about the fledgling organization, membership grew rapidly, spreading across the U.S. In the early 1900s, membership spread into Canada, Mexico and Panama. Today, Shriners International is a fraternity with nearly 200 temples in several countries, thousands of clubs around the world and hundreds of thousands of members dedicated to the principles of brotherly love, relief and truth.

Nobles All - Greeting

From time to time, I am questioned about what Shriners Hospitals for Children can or cannot treat. I have attempted to compile a very comprehensive list.

Since our first hospital opened its doors in 1922, providing care for pediatric orthopaedic conditions has been a foundation of Shriners Hospitals for Children. We can help children with essentially any orthopaedic condition, other than an acute trauma.

Orthopaedic Care

Shriners Hospitals for Children is dedicated to providing medical and rehabilitative services to children with congenital deformities and conditions, problems resulting from orthopaedic injuries, and diseases of the neuromusculoskeletal system.

Innovative treatment and therapies

The majority of our locations provide pediatric orthopaedic care. Commonly treated conditions include:

- Clubfoot
- Hand disorders
- Limb deficiencies/discrepancies
- Legg-Calvé-Perthes disease and other hip disorders
- Scoliosis (curvature of the spine)
- Osteogenesis imperfecta (brittle bone disease)
- Juvenile idiopathic arthritis
- Orthopaedic problems associated with cerebral palsy and spina bifida
- At 12 of our locations, the orthopaedic physicians and clinical staff have access to motion analysis centers. These high-tech facilities use a system of reflective markers, high-speed cameras and computers to develop a model of a child's walking pattern that can provide data to assist the medical team in recommending the best treatment plan.

Pediatric Orthotic and Prosthetic Services, LLC

In addition to innovative treatments and therapies, several Shriners Hospitals for Children have in-house pediatric orthotic and prosthetic services (POPS) departments. The POPS teams fabricate custom-fit devices in kid-friendly environments. Collaborating closely with physicians, nurses, and occupational and physical therapists, the best possible outcomes are achieved for their patients.

Services to support optimum health and independence

Our goal is to help each child become as healthy and independent as possible. We are dedicated to providing a complete range of appropriate medical and rehabilitative care to achieve this objective, including surgeries; physical, occupational and recreation therapies; and orthotic and prosthetic services.

At Shriners Hospitals for Children, each patient receives an individualized care plan incorporating the full range of needed multidisciplinary services, always incorporating the patient and family's goals and addressing their concerns.

Burn Care

The Shriners Hospitals for Children locations that specialize in burn injuries have been leaders in burn care, research and education since opening in the mid-1960s. Thanks to the cutting-edge medical care provided at these hospitals, thousands of children have a greater chance of surviving from all types of burn injuries every year.

Burn care and other specialized services

The Shriners Hospitals specializing in burn care provide critical, surgical and rehabilitative care to children with varying degrees of new and healed burns. Each state-of-the-art hospital is staffed and equipped to provide reconstructive and restorative surgery for healed burns, as well as treatments for various other skin conditions. Three of our four locations that provide burn care also treat cleft lip and palate.

The range of treatments needed by patients with burn injuries can include skin grafting procedures, continuous enteral feeding, infection control and procedures to lessen the effects of scarring. In addition, aggressive rehabilitation is typically necessary, including therapy to improve range of motion, and the use of specially fitted garments, splints and other orthotic appliances to improve the patient's ability and appearance. Once a patient has recovered sufficiently to return to their homes and communities, Shriners Hospitals for Children helps to ensure a smooth transition through its readjustment and re-entry programs.

The medical staff at Shriners Hospitals for Children is renowned for their expertise in critical care, particularly in techniques that may help save the life of a patient with severe burn injuries – such as fluid resuscitation, management of smoke inhalation, early excision and skin grafting, and management of increased metabolism.

Since Shriners Hospitals for Children entered the burn care field, the survival rate for children with burns over more than 50 percent of their body surface has doubled. In addition, today, patients with burns over 90 percent can survive, and go on to lead full, productive lives.

Spinal Cord Injury

Each year 12,000 new cases of spinal cord injury (SCI) are reported throughout the U.S. Approximately 10 percent affect children under age 16. In the mid-1980s, Shriners Hospitals for Children established the nation's first SCI rehabilitation programs specifically designed for children and teenagers.

Innovative care contributes to recovery

At Shriners Hospitals for Children, an interdisciplinary team of surgeons and other physicians, therapeists, therapeutic recreation specialists, psychologists, social workers and dieticians work together to provide individualized, comprehensive care plans for our patients with SCI. In addition to providing treatment, our staff works with the patient's family members to help them understand the social, emotional and developmental implications of an SCI to help ensure the best possible outcome for the child, including the ability to have a full, productive life.

Innovative therapies offered at Shriners Hospitals for Children include body-weight supported manual treadmill training or robotic treadmill training with the Lokomat, a device that automates movement therapy and improves the efficiency of treadmill training in patients with neurological movement disorders, such as spinal cord injury. Both of these therapies provide weight-bearing opportunities and can help stimulate muscles and build strength and stamina.

Our programs also offer functional electric stimulation (FES), which is a sophisticated, computerized system that sends small doses of electrical current to peripheral nerves, stimulating paralyzed muscles. FES can be used with specialized bikes to provide an opportunity for exercise.

We also emphasize activity-based rehabilitation, including aqua therapy, pet therapy and adaptive sports. These activities also increase strength and stamina and enhance social interaction, confidence and independence.

Emphasizing independence and confidence

In addition to exercise and therapy efforts, we offer a range of experiential programs designed to increase independent living skills, build confidence and strengthen self-esteem.

The health care system's SCI program is designed to provide the complete range of services needed to ensure patients recover to the greatest extent possible.

Cleft Lip / Cleft Palate

At Shriners Hospitals for Children, patients with a cleft lip and/or palate are treated by a multidisciplinary group of specialists who work as a team to improve the child's appearance and their ability to eat, breathe and communicate. Each patient's unique treatment plan may include surgery, orthodontics, hearing, speech and psychological therapies, along with specialized support. The goal of the Shriners Hospital treatment program is to help each child achieve optimal function, improve their facial appearance to the fullest extent possible and restore their self-esteem.

Cleft lip and palate deformities are one of the most common birth defects in the U.S., occurring in approximately one of every 600 births. Clefts occur when the tissues that form the upper lip and roof of the mouth fail to join together before birth. Cleft deformities vary in size and because the lips and palate develop at different times, it is possible for babies to be born with a cleft lip only, a cleft palate only, or both. The condition is associated with alterations in oral function including eating, speaking and hearing due to problems with growth and structure of the face. Cleft lip and palate is corrected by reconstructive surgery in conjunction with multidisciplinary therapies.

Cleft lip and palate is a common and serious condition. Shriners Hospitals for Children is committed to improving care for children with this condition through a comprehensive, coordinated program of clinical excellence, education and research.

Care for cleft lip and/or cleft palate is currently available at nine Shriners Hospitals for Children. Available multidisciplinary services include surgery, orthodontics, hearing, speech, psychological therapies and additional support services. Services may vary at different locations.

Our mission


